LYING FEMINIST OF THE MONTH



J4MB presents the October 2015 Lying Feminist of the Month award to Samantha Beckett – Director General, Economics & Markets, Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (DBIS). Since 2012 Campaign for Merit in Business (C4MB) has been pointing politicians, civil servants, and others, to evidence of a causal link between increasing female representation on boards and corporate financial decline – yet the government continues to force FTSE100 companies into appointing more women onto their boards. In 2012 Mike Buchanan gave evidence to a House of Commons inquiry – the video of his appearance is here – with details of five longitudinal studies, all of them demonstrating the link. In our response we also acknowledged that the academic literature is mixed in findings regarding the impact of gender diversity on corporate performance – while we accept that some studies have found evidence to support the hypothesis than an increase in gender diversity can be associated with a reduction in performance, there are other studies that have shown the opposite. [my emphasis]

On 17.9.15 Mike Buchanan publicly challenged Ms Beckett – the letter is <u>here</u>:
