[J4MB](#) presents the Toxic Feminist of the Month award (March 2016) to [Caroline Criado-Perez](#), one of three awards she's won this month in recognition of her whiny letter to Boris Johnson, and the associated [petition](#), demanding 'a statue of a suffragette in Parliament Square to mark 100 years of female suffrage'. Her letter starts with this gem:

There are eleven statues in Parliament Square. Not a single one is of a woman.

It's a matter of historical record that the Suffragettes *delayed* female emancipation.¹ Anyone wishing to understand the truth about the Suffragettes, and the history of male and female emancipation, should read articles by [Herbert Purdy](#) and [William Collins](#). Half the men killed or maimed in the trenches in the final year of World War I, 10 years before female emancipation, had no vote. Compared with women, men suffered grievously – often sacrificing their lives or limbs – before full emancipation. Feminists have nothing to whine about with respect to female emancipation (or anything else, to be fair).
