The purpose of the panel and the enquiry is '....to gather evidence on how the family courts protect children and parents in cases of domestic abuse and other serious offences.'

The panel includes at least two well-known feminist academics whose independence is highly questionable. It also includes the Acting Co-Chief Executive of Women's Aid. There are no representatives from Wales and none who understand or represent the experience of fathers.

We are writing to Paul Maynard MP to request that our charity be invited to put forward a representative to address concerns of bias and ensure greater public confidence in the enquiry.

## WHAT WE'RE ASKING FROM YOU?

- 1. Table a question to the Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Justice Paul Maynard MP about the selection process for the panel including the criteria determined for membership and specifically why no individual who represents the experience of fathers nor anyone who can represent the interests and perspectives of Wales has been included in the panel when a representative body for women ie Women's Aid?
- 2. Support our proposal for a representative of our charity to join the panel to ensure that both Wales and the experience of fathers is properly represented.
